## **MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD**

This term there are a number of events that happen beyond the everyday curriculum; we have trips and visits outside of school; sporting competitions and yesterday our fabulous choir went and spent the afternoon with residents at Quince Court. It is really important that we take advantage of these opportunities as they teach the children the broader values as well as giving them the opportunity to role model their behaviour for others. Teaching the Values is key and each month we have a different focus - these are all at the top of the newsletter; the pupils know what these values look like and how to demonstrate them as well as the importance of adhering to them in different situations. It is always good to hear when a group or class return from a trip how they have been praised and it has been noticed by others that their behaviour and manners are good.

"We have learned about the Anglo-Saxons and how they settled, and made their


In **Year 4** they are discovering when and why the Anglo-Saxons come to Britain. They are identifying where the Vikings came from and are using chronology to order events.



Year 5 have learned about the Tudor family tree and how the Tudor period began. They have looked at primary sources of evidence and the children have had to discuss whether King Henry V||| was a tyrant or a fair ruler.

The children in **Year 6** have been thinking about the significance of the people featured on bank notes. They have been discussing the contributions that the people have made in history and why they were selected.
