Maths

This term we will be building on our knowledge of number and place value. In doing so, there will be lots of opportunities to develop our addition and subtraction skills up to 20, using concrete tools to do so. And reach up to 50 when counting and using a number line.

Finishing off the term, we will begin exploring measurement such as length, height. mass and volume. Science

In our science this term the children will begin to delve into materials. They will explore the features and properties of different materials as well as how and why they might be used. This will be concluded when we decide which material would be best to make a shield! Following from this, we will focus on how animals, and humans, have offspring that grow into adults and look at the differences between adult animals and their offspring.

Phonics

In phonics this term, we will continue our learning of Level 5 phonemes, and include this in our writing as we learn them.

This learning will start with split digraphs such as a_e, i_e, u_e, and e_e. The children will begin by learning the phoneme and how it is said, building into recognising them as graphemes and finally using this developing phonic knowledge within their writing.

Music
