Maths

We will be recapping fractions by -Adding and subtracting, partition the whole, unit and non-unit fractions of a set of objects and problem solving and reasoning with fractions of an amount.

Measurement will be based on money and time by – investigating pounds and pence, converting pounds and pence, adding and subtracting money, then finding change.

Shape will be based on turns, angles and right angles, measuring and draw accurately, recognizing and describing 2-D/3-D shapes

Science

This term the theme for Science is 'Plants' pupils will be taught to identify and describe the different parts of a plant: root, stem/trunk, leaves and flowers. Explore the requirements of plants for life and growth; air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow. Pupils will investigate the way in which water is transported within plants and explore the part flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants. including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

Year 3 and 4 will be taking a trip to the RSPB together. Year 3 will be able to consolidate their plant knowledge there.

Art

Children are introduced to artists that combine paint and sewing, art and craft, to make work. We will explore how these artists use fabric, paint and thread to make work in response to landscapes. Children are invited to start by creating an underpainting on cloth, using paint in a fluid and intuitive way. They then go on to explore sewing not as a precise technical craft, but as an alternative way to make intuitive, textural marks, over the painted backgrounds. Sketchbooks and drawing are used as a way for pupils to discover their own personal response to the landscape used as stimulus, and as a way to explore mark making, colour and composition.
