# **MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD**

This week I want to share our school priorities with you for this academic year. Our School Development Plan (SDP) is our strategic plan for improvement.

- It allows the whole school community to understand the school's areas for development within the context of our school vision
- It provides everyone with a clear understanding of the school's goals and how they will be achieved
- It contains timescales for implementation to ensure accountability
- It allows the school to determine how to effectively use resources to meet goals
- It helps the school to budget and determine spending priorities
- It clarifies the key priorities the school believes are the most important to address at this time

We constantly review everything we do based on self-evaluation (SEF), assessments, observations, feedback and the needs of our pupils. These reviews help us to identify priorities and form the core of our SDP.

We believe it's important to allow everyone the chance to contribute ideas for school improvement. We ask parents, staff, governors and our children to share their ideas through action planning, questionnaires and via the school councils. Staff members play a key role in determining our priorities and ensuring their success. Staff development forms a large part of our school improvement process, with staff encouraged to undertake training throughout the year, both internally and externally, and INSET days are planned to enhance teaching and learning.

Once the SDP is agreed, we review it at least **termly** to ensure we are meeting expectations and are on course to deliver our promises. I report to the Governing Body to allow the Governors to understand the progress that is being made; subject leaders' Action Plans are also considered alongside this document; linked Governors work alongside staff members to allow progress in individual subjects or areas of responsibility to be identified.

Our priorities for this year are:

- Improve outcomes in reading and writing, particularly at KS2 by: developing and embedding higher-order reading skills; developing accuracy in grammar and creating more opportunities for extended writing.
- Continue to develop the curriculum with a specific focus on: developing foundation subjects, including assessment; whole school knowledge and understanding of the EYFS framework.
- Continue to develop leadership at all levels within the whole school community by: making ready use of tools available to strengthen succession planning for governors in order that a skilful execution of strategic responsibilities is maintained; developing the part pupils play in leadership and development; the development of peer coaching and succession planning.
- To ensure all children make accelerated progress towards a Good Level of Development (GLD) at the end of Reception.
- I look forward to sharing more about how we are achieving this over the coming weeks. Have a good weekend.

# Anti-Bullying at Maple Tree

We are excited to announce that we have signed up to the Anti-Bullying Alliance's school award programme called 'United Against Bullying'. It supports schools to reduce bullying and improve the wellbeing of all children, focusing on those most at risk.



As part of this programme, the school, led by Miss Hyde, are going to be reviewing our approach to Anti-bullying in the following areas:

- Anti-bullying policy review our current policy and update with input from pupils, parents/carers and staff.
- **Reporting and recording bullying** review how bullying is currently reported (how and to who) and how it is recorded and monitored by school leaders.
- **Prevention and awareness**—consider how the school teaches children about bullying in order to raise awareness and prevent it from happening.
- Acting on reports— explore how we support children experiencing bullying—both those being bullied or being the bully.
- **Staff training**—review how staff across school are trained in relation to anti-bullying by assessing their current subject knowledge.
- Focus on vulnerable groups—explore how the voices of all pupils are included and how we can best support our most vulnerable pupils.

### What is happening first?

**Monday 14th November is the start of Anti-Bullying week**. During this week we will be launching the theme for this year, which is 'Reach Out' through a whole school assembly. Monday 14th is also 'odd socks' day where the children are encouraged to wear odd socks as an opportunity to encourage people to express themselves,

celebrate their individuality and what makes us all unique!

During Anti-Bullying week, in class, we will be teaching about what bullying is and undertaking lessons on how to combat bullying. We will be asking them for their views on anti-bullying at school, creating a new whole school pledge and then finally showing off our learning on an open afternoon.




## Creating a new Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)
