For new parents and those still to join, please look out for your join letter, or ask the office. For existing parents, please remember to check you have the latest MarvellousMe parent app installed and are logged in. You don't want to miss out!

What to expect? Teachers will be:

- Sharing a learning comment (activity) with all parents **at least** two times a week, such as a summary of what they have been learning about.
- Ensuring every child receives a MarvellousMe badge every **1-2 weeks**.

Teachers may:

- Send out message reminders for things like PE kits or letters coming home.
- Send out badges for children in different classes.
