When you click on each section you will be given a drop down list which will offer you more options, however there is also




information on the 'landing' page of each section so if you click on the title without using the drop down it will take you to the first page of each section. You can then access the side panel to take you to the page you are looking for.

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A focus on Science

Reception

Adult led: This week Fir have been thinking about all of the different wildlife and types of land that we have in their county, as they have finished their contribution to the Central Bedfordshire biodiversity competition.

Independent Learning

We have been investigating which items will roll, and which will not.

Yew class have been making observations about the seasons, and at this time of year particularly autumn. They have been comparing the weather on a day to day basis, and are going on an Autumn walk. They will

they will be investigating food chains.





Year 2

Aspen have been looking at the topic *Plants*, and are learning the different parts of a bulb. They are making their own scientific drawings and labelling the parts. They are also observing the effects of the bulb over time!

Year 3

Rowan have been looking at *Light* and *Rocks* as their topics. They have investigated light sources, reflection and reflective surfaces. They experimented with torches and opaque, transparent and translucent materials.

Year 5

Juniper and Cherry have been learning about puberty and some of the changes that take place at this time, as part of their *Animals including Humans* science topic.



Year 6

As part of their *Electricity* topic, Elder have been investigating the question 'Does the length of a wire affect the brightness of a bulb?' They carried out a fair test where they had to decide which variables to keep or change.

Autumn term so far in Rowan!

For the whole of Autumn term we have been studying a topic based on life in the Stone Age, this has been an enjoyable experience and children have had the opportunity to learn about prehistoric Britain, the timeline of the Stone Age, how people survived and the changes that happened throughout the period. We have linked this learning to history and geography and even art and design!

Our English learning has been formulated on the theme using some fantastic texts with a variety of genres. In Autumn 1 children have enjoyed reading fiction texts then writing questions, predictions, descriptions and performed and wrote their own poetry. During this half term we have based our learning around non-fiction and researched in more depth the Stone Age to write non-chronological reports. During whole school topics such as Black History Month and Anti-Bullying Week we have expressed our learning through diary entries, letter writing and creating informative posters.




Rowan Class Cave Paintings

We have learnt a great deal in maths

so far this term. We have used our previous knowledge to extend mathematical concepts such as place value, addition and subtraction, along with multiplication

During Science lessons we have experimented with light sources, reflection, opaque, translucent and transparent materials. We have also investigated and tested different types of rocks. "I enjoy extending my maths." "I like the 4 times table it's like




"I loved our lesson when we turned off all the light sources and it was dark!" We have loved learning about different religions in RE - this term we have learnt about Buddhism and Hinduism.

"We took off our shoes and entered the classroom as if it was a temple, we then did some chanting—it was fun!" "We watched a video to give us information, I enjoyed it very much."

Our Art lessons have consisted of both art research and skills. We researched the art work of Carl Warner and Giuseppe Arcimboldo and then used sketching pencils to create a still life using real fruit and vegetables. We have designed and painted memorial stones for Remembrance Day. We looked at fossils in detail; and drew inspiration from their line, patterns and shapes to make our own clay fossils.
