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MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD

What a busy week! It has been great to see the children embarking on their second week back and there is so much to share. Normally, our Ofsted visit would have been the first thing within this newsletter, but our award from the Anti-Bullying Alliance needed to take front page news - this is something that we worked incredibly hard on last year and I am extremely grateful to Miss Hyde for all she has done in implementing strategies, collecting and collating evidence before submitting our application. It is a reason to be proud of our achievements.

And then of course, there was our Ofsted inspection! This was very early on in the term but was well overdue so it was welcomed when we got the call. At this stage I am unable to share the outcome with you, as it has to go through a rigorous quality assurance process and therefore will not be published for about a month. I am also unable to share this with staff so I would respectively ask that you do not pressure staff for information regarding the judgement made - they do not know!

I know you will be keen to find out how we did and I want to assure you that we saw many positives this week and the children showed us all exactly why they are the best children in Sandy! Their respectful attitudes towards each other, their kindness and compassion and strong behaviour for learning were, as always, evident throughout. They spoke confidently about their learning and shared the work in their books from this year and last. Children and staff across the school were spoken to and lessons were visited, children were observed at points outside of the classroom environment too during break times and assembly.

We had a really good response to the parent survey that was sent out and I am grateful to all parents who took part in this. The results are largely positive and where there are areas that we, as a school, have identified need further work, we will be using our Parent Forum as the place to unpick some of these further so if your class does not yet have a rep, please do contact us via teacher@mapletreeprimaryschool.com if you are happy to nominate yourself. It is really key that we have a complete group so we can ensure communication and interaction with all year groups across the school. Dates for this year's meetings can be found over the page.

Parent Forum

Our parent forum meet 6 times a year (once per half term) to take part in discussion surrounding whole school issues such as vision or anti-bullying as well as being an opportunity to raise relevant and pertinent questions about things such as pick up and drop off, communication, uniform, general questions etc. The meetings are run by the Head and Deputy Head and are attended by a parent representative from each year group. These parents nominate themselves and are agreed by the rest of the parents in that cohort. The reps collect questions and topics for discussion from the parents and feedback after the meeting - though formal minutes are also circulated to all parents following the meeting.
