Final weekend to write a poem—deadline is Monday 16th October!


Thank you to the wonderful entries we have received so far.

Online Safety Parent Evening

Thursday 16th November 2023 6:30-7:30pm

Join us for an evening learning about how to keep children safe online

run by a Cyber Protect & Prevent officer within the Cybercrime Hub in Bedfordshire Police.

You will learn:

- how your online behaviour can impact your child,
- about the dangers of parents sharing sensitive information about their child online,
- how to keep your child safe when using popular apps and websites such as: youtube, roblox and tiktok
- and much more!

This will be run as an interactive session to get you thinking about the hidden dangers of online use. Other topics surrounding Cybercrime such as online gaming, social media interaction, sharing of indecent images and hacking are also incorporated throughout the session.
