## **MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD**

I am delighted to be able to share with you that, following our inspection on the 13th and 14th September, our Ofsted report is now out and we continue to be a **Good school!** The full report has been sent out with this newsletter but there are many positives identified by the inspector over the two days that she was with us.

The new Ofsted Inspection framework was introduced since our last inspection back in 2018, when we were inspected as a lower school, and is a lot more focused on the ambition of the curriculum whilst ensuring that the needs of the whole child and their wider development are prioritised. This increase in expectation is particularly hard when subject leaders are not specialists in their subjects or when teachers have more than one subject to lead on, but our staff have worked extremely hard over the last few years. Despite the difficulties they have faced during the covid pandemic and our extended transition to a primary school, they have ensured that their skills and knowledge are up to date in order to review the curriculum to ensure it meets pupils' needs. The inspector recognised that 'The school has developed an ambitious curriculum. It starts in the early years and build pupils' learning over time.'

As expected, the pupils did us proud and the inspector was quick to see that 'they value kindness and friendship highly, and demonstrate this in their welcome to visitors.' She commended school on the relationships throughout school as being 'warm and positive'; where 'adults have high expectations and pupils strive to meet these.'

Reading is the most important skill that children should develop and we have worked hard across the school to identify this as a priority where 'Throughout the early years and key stage 1, pupils gradually acquire the knowledge and skills they need to become fluent readers...Adults ensure that any pupils who struggle with reading get effective extra help.'

We also pride ourselves on the fact that Maple Tree is an inclusive school and all pupils, regardless of their particular needs, are offered teaching which will enable them to make the best possible progress in school. This was also recognised by the inspector: 'Pupils with SEND are quickly identified. Support is put in place so that they can access the same learning as their peers.'

Safety and our values remain central to our vision and ethos: our 'safeguarding is effective' and 'the school values underpin every aspect of school life.' The inspector was quick to see that our 'pupils' understanding of difference is well developed' and 'they know that everyone should be treated with tolerance and respect.'

The inspector recognised all the good work that has gone on so far and agreed with our self-evaluation judgements, recognising, as we do that 'Maple Tree is a happy, inclusive school.' Like all schools, we continue to focus on our curriculum and the report acknowledges that our next step is to further develop our approach to assessment so that all assessment opportunities are purposeful and consistent, which is already part of our school development plan for this year.

We are grateful to you for the positive parent responses you shared with the inspector during the time she was here and we are pleased to be able to share the report with you so quickly. I hope you all have a **GOOD** weekend!




