




- 1. **Parental controls:** It is advisable to set parent controls on your internet at home. On this website, you can select your provider and will give you a step by step guide on it and has all the guides which we would recommend. https://www.internetmatters.org/parental-controls/. - Screen time: having clear boundaries for screen time can help children manage living in this digital

- 4. **Password strength:** check the strength of your password using this website: https://www.passwordmonster.com/


We hope that these help to keep you and your families safe online.

Juniper Class Year 5

English

We are reading the book 'Cosmic' by Frank Cottrell-Boyce. This sci-fi story is about an eleven year old boy who is much taller than his friends and is mistaken for an adult. We have been looking at how the main character is taking advantage of this through describing with complex and short sentences. With the skills of different sentence structures, at the end of this unit the children will be writing a short sci-fi story.





Maths

We are learning about fractions, with a particular focus on equivalent fractions, improper fractions and mixed numbers. These skill have then been used to help add fractions of different denominators and mixed numbers. Fractions can be difficult to gasp so we have been doing a lot of practice so help secure the knowledge.

Geography

This term we have been looking at where The Alps are in Europe and comparing our local area to that of the mountainous region of The Alps. We have been learning to about contour lines and how to read maps to help compare the areas.





Science

We started the topic with a great lesson discussing and debating if the Earth is spherical or flat. The children took time to consider and question the evidence for both theories and some still have good arguments for the flat Earth theory! We have also learnt how we have night and day and also discussed why we have different seasons and countries near the equator do not.
