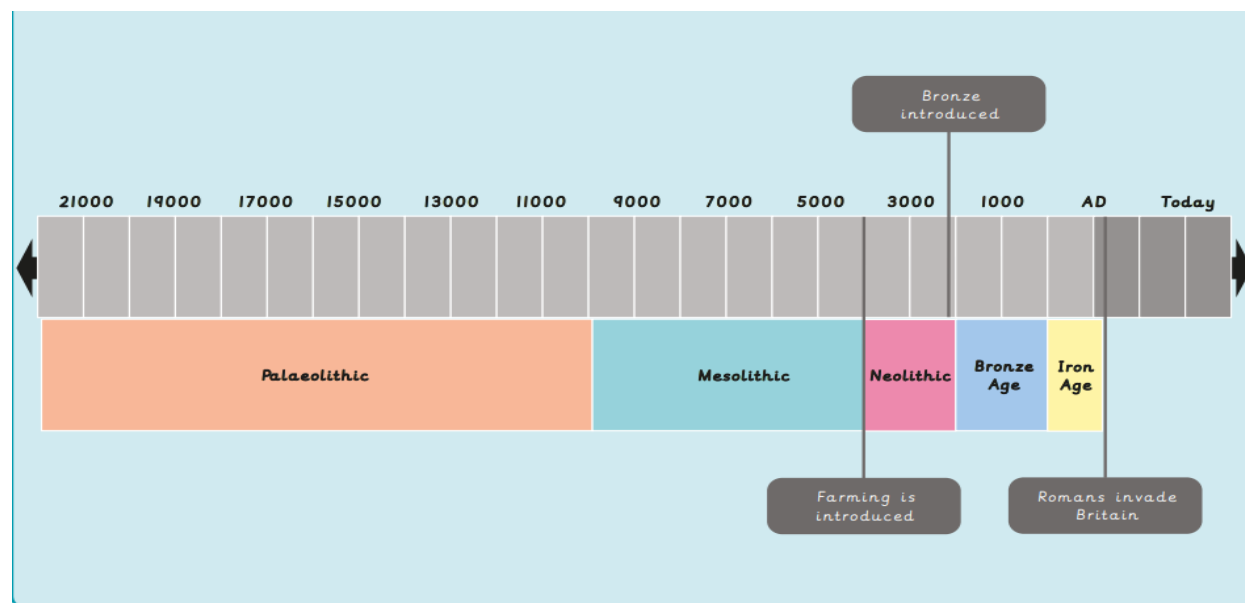
#### What should I already know?

Vocabulary	
<b>Archaeologist</b>	A person who learns about the past by recovering buildings, graves and other objects that belonged to people from the past.
<b>AD</b>	Used to show dates after the birth of Jesus, for example, 2023 AD
<b>BC</b>	A way of dating years before the birth of Jesus.
<b>bartering</b>	Trading by exchanging one item for another item, without the use of money.
<b>hunter gatherer</b>	A group of people who move around hunting and collecting food.
<b>settlement</b>	A place where people live together in buildings as a community.
<b>trade</b>	Buying or selling objects that are made or grown such as copper, tin, bronze, olive oil and wine.
<b>tribe</b>	A group of people that lived together in a hill or fort who share the same language and ideas usually led by a chief or king.
<b>Neolithic</b>	An archaeological period, the final division of the Stone Age in Europe, Asia and Africa
<b>Stone Age</b>	A broad prehistoric period during which stone was widely used to make stone tools with an edge, a point, or a percussion surface
<b>Bronze Age</b>	A historic period, lasting approximately from 3300 BC to 1200 BC, characterized by the use of bronze.
<b>Iron Age</b>	The final epoch of the three-age division of the prehistory and protohistory of humanity.
<b>prehistoric</b>	Relating to or denoting the period before written records.
